Alberto Tarozzi is full professor in the sector SPS/07 General Sociology at the Department of Economics, Management, Society and Institutions of the Università del Molise.

He taught at the Università degli Studi di Bologna where he hold the chair of Development Sociology (1983-2005) as associate professor.

He published volumes and essays in Italian, French, English, Spanish and German. He wrote on different issues from general sociology to development sociology such as initiatives of civil society in the field of voluntary action and social movements, limits to growth in the complex societies, links between social changes, modernization and morphology of the contemporary social systems, crossed by the globalization problems.
