

Professor Dr Federico Pernazza (born on 20 June 1966), studied law at the *Università di Roma La Sapienza* (1985-1990). In 1996, he obtained his Ph.D. in Comparative and European Private Law with a comparative study of the corporation Law of France and Italy.

Since 1998, Dr Pernazza has taught International Commercial Law, Private Law of the European Community, Comparative Private Law, Comparative Private Law of the Economy in various Italian Universities such as *Università di Roma La Sapienza*, *LUISS Guido Carli* in Rome, *Università di Genova* and *Università di Cassino*.

In 2005, he was appointed Associate Professor of Comparative Private Law at the *Università del Molise*, where he currently teaches both Comparative Private Law and International Commercial Law. In addition, during the period 2007-2011, he was visiting professor at the *Université de Franche-Comté* (France) and since 2010 he teaches Comparative Private Law at *LuiSS Guido Carli* in Rome.

Professor Pernazza has been a member of the Rome Bar since 1993 and is a member of the Commission for International relationships of the *Consiglio Nazionale Forense* and a consultant for the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Paris. He has published more than seventy articles in Italian, English and French on comparative private law, European and European Member States' company law, commercial contracts, directors' liability, financial markets, bankruptcy and fair trade. He is author and editor of several volumes on the same subjects and has participated as speaker before numerous national and international congresses in Italy, England, France, Germany, Denmark and Brazil.
